
#### Introduction

As a firm we recognise the importance of a diverse workforce to enable us to be the best firm for our people, our clients and our community



#### 2. What is your sex?







### 4. Is your gender identity the same as your sex registered at birth?





## 5. Do you consider yourself to have a disability according to the definition in the Equality Act 2010?







## 6. Are your activities limited by health problems or disability which has/is expected to last 12 months?













### 11. Which type of school did you attend for the most time between the ages of 11 and 16?






